

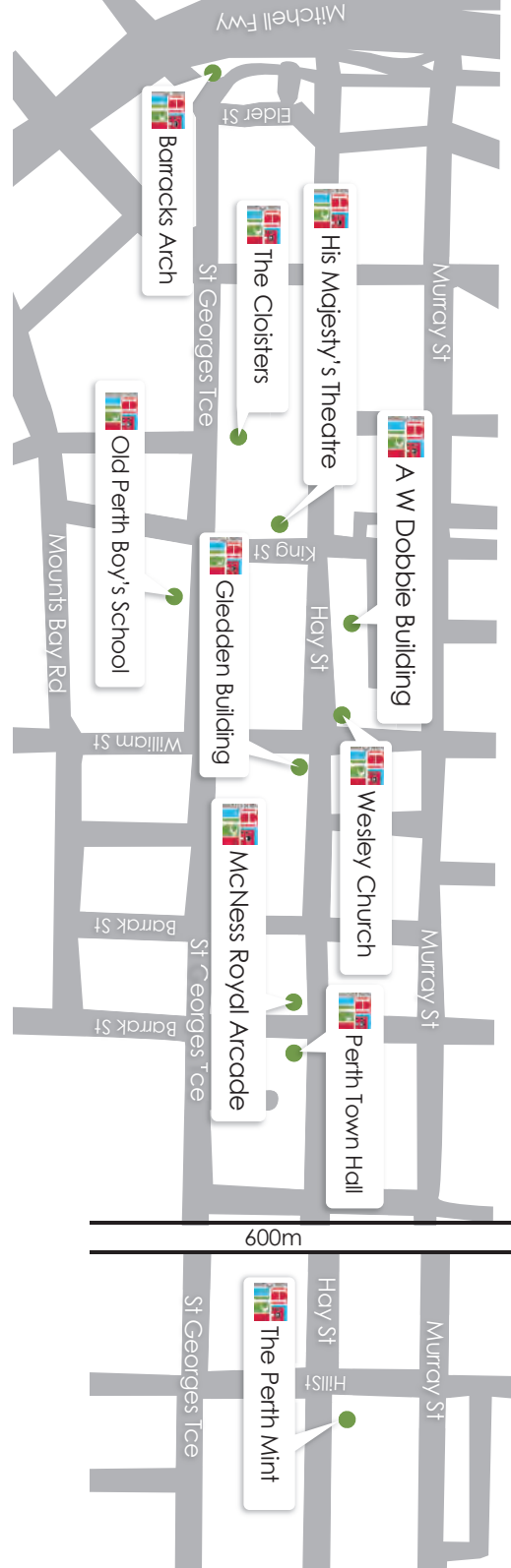

WELCOME TO AN EXCITING NEW WAY TO MAKE DISCOVERING THE HISTORIC PLACES OF PERTH'S CITY CENTRE FUN.

The Heritage Perth 'Hi-Tech Heritage Trail' (a first in Australia) uses the wonders of 'Wi-Fi' technology to take you on a fantastic journey of historic exploration. Using your mobile phone or other Wi-Fi enabled devices you can visit ten sites around the city and download, free-of-charge, text, audio and photographic information about the building you are viewing.

Using the trail enables people of all ages to get to know Perth. The great advantage is that you can explore at your own pace, pausing wherever you like and continuing when convenient - this makes it ideal for families with young children or those who want to explore the city at a leisurely pace.

There are currently 10 heritage places that can be accessed on the H-Tech Trail:

Town Hall – the only convict-built town hall in Australia

Old Perth Boy's School – Perth's first purpose built school

The Cloisters – where secondary education was established in WA

Barracks Arch – all that is left of the Perth Pensioner Barracks

His Majesty's Theatre – the only remaining working Edwardian theatre in Australia

McNess Royal Arcade – Charles McNess's shopping arcade legacy for the city

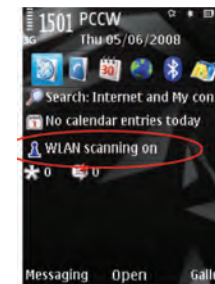
The Perth Mint – the oldest working mint in the world

The Gledden Building – Perth's 1937 answer to the Empire State Building

Wesley Church - an 1870 church for an expanding Methodist congregation

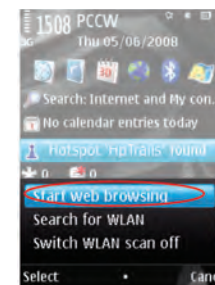
A W Dobbie Building – where some of the first wireless sets in WA were on sale

To get on to the trail, follow these instructions and begin discovering the historic delights of Perth (allow about 1-1½ hours for the whole trail):



2. Search for available WLAN. In this example, "HpTrails" is found

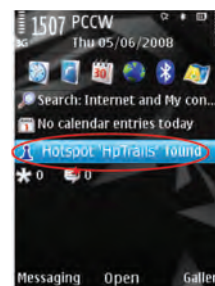
3. Click on the WLAN icon > select "Stat web browsing"

Setup for WiFi browsing:

1. Go to WiFi Wizard to turn on WLAN at standby page

note: you must be in close proximity of the site (usually less than 30 meters) to connect to the hotspot
